FY 18-19 Funds Recommended for Reprogramming

- □ Ref. #10 Homeless Engagement Teams -Citywide- \$275,000 is pending Council approval to be repurposed to purchase of vehicle fleet in FY18/19.
- Ref. #11 Homeless Engagement Teams (HOPE Project)- \$206,452 is being recommended for reprogramming based on the following: \$106,452 has been approved through budget modification to be used to pay DHS subcontractor invoices in FY18/19. \$100,000 is pending Council approval to be repurposed to purchase of vehicle fleet in FY18/19.
- Ref. #13 Operations Healthy Streets (OHS)- \$325,250 is being recommended for reprogramming based on the following: \$50,000 is pending Council approval to be repurposed to purchase of vehicle fleet and \$80,000 for WSP maintenance and improvements in FY18/19. In addition, through an approved budget modification, \$195,250 of savings will be utilized for one time moving cost (The Bin relocation) in FY18/19 leaving a balance of \$127,011 in underspend.

Total Funds Recommended for Reprogramming: \$806,702

FY 18-19 Budget Saving Report

- Ref. #10 Homeless Engagement Teams -Citywide- Underspend of \$289,931 in FY18/19, due to staff attrition and the competitive job market for filling vacancies.
- Ref. #11 Homeless Engagement Teams (HOPE Project)- Underspend of \$134,667 in FY18/19, due to staff attrition and the competitive job market for filling vacancies.
- □ Ref. #13 Operations Healthy Streets (OHS)-Underspend of \$127,011 in FY18/19.
- Ref. #16 Oasis at San Julian Center- Underspend of \$123,474 in FY18/19 is due to the delay in completion of the San Julian project, which has impacted the ability to spend down this line item towards the program operations for this fiscal year.

Total FY18-19 Budget Savings Report: \$675,083 (Note: \$651,759 of this amount is being used to offset the FY 2019 – 20 General Fund appropriation as reflected on page 1008 of 2019-20 Blue Book Vol.2)
