SUMMARY

This is the fifth quarterly expenditure report on the City's \$85,013,607 State of California Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) grant award (January 1 – March 31, 2020). As of March 31, 2020, the City had committed 99 percent of these funds; and expended 52 percent. The City is on pace to meet the deadline to expend 100 percent of HEAP funds by June 30, 2021.

This report provides the status of HEAP commitments and expenditures through March 31, 2020, reprogramming and funding recommendations, and outlines reprogramming actions since the fourth quarterly expenditure report.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Homeless Strategy Committee review the following recommendations and forward to the Mayor and City Council for consideration:

- 1. RECOGNIZE \$158,393.85 in interest earned on the Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) grant receipts in Fund 60P, RSRC 4903 as of March 31, 2020, and allocate to Activity Category 1 – Capital and Operating Support – A Bridge Home;
- 2. REPROGRAM \$2,478,150.49 that will not be expended by June 30, 2020, or by the Statemandated HEAP deadline of June 30,2021, as follows:
 - i. \$103,541.23 from Activity Category 3 Capital, Operating, Services Citywide; the balance of an allocation to the City Administrative Officer for the purchase of a modular hygiene trailer for the CD 2 Sherman Way Navigation Center, to Activity Category 1, Capital and Operating Support – A Bridge Home to offset the \$11,800,818 of ABH operations costs for the following sites in Fiscal Year 2020-2021:

- iii. \$702,850 from Activity Category 2, Capital and Operations Support Skid Row, allocated to LAHSA, for the Skid Row Bin Tenant Improvements (\$86,850) and for the restrooms at St Vincent De Paul (\$616,000), to the Board of Public Works to continue the Skid Row Pit Stop Program, July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021;
- iv. \$1,052,787 from Activity Category 2, Capital and Operations Support Skid Row, allocated to the Board of Public Works for the Pit Stop Program in Skid Row (\$243,023) and the Skid Row Sidewalk Sweeping and Litter Abatement (\$809,764), to the Board of Public Work for the continuation of these two programs, July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021; and
- v. \$158.126.26 from the Activity Category 5 Administrative Costs, allocated the Board of Public Works, to the Board of Public Works for administrative costs, July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021.

- 4. APPROVE \$388,013 from Activity Category 2 Capital and Operating Support Skid Row for the Skid Row Pit Stop Program, July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021.
- 5. APPROVE Authorize the City Administrative Officer to:
 - i. Prepare Controller instructions or make any necessary technical adjustments consistent with the Mayor and Council action in this matter, and authorize the Controller to implement these instructions; and
 - ii. Prepare any additional Controller instructions to reimburse City Departments for their accrued labor, material or permit costs related to projects in this report consistent with

the Mayor and Council action on this matter and authorize the Controller to implement these instructions.

DISCUSSION

Status of HEAP Commitments and Expenditures

As of March 31, 2020, \$85,050,307 or 99 percent of HEAP funds, including interest, had been committed; \$1,133,630 remained uncommitted. A total of \$44,551,298 or 52 percent, including interest, had been expended.

Table 1 summarizes HEAP expenditures and commitments and reflects \$255,163.47 in interest earnings allocated in the fourth HEAP Quarterly Expenditure Report, increasing the total HEAP grant, including interest, from \$85,928,773 to \$86,183,937. Attachment 1 provides additional detail.

Interest Earned on HEAP Deposits

The City has earned an additional \$158,393.85 in interest from its HEAP allocation since December 31, 2019. This Office recommends earned interest be allocated to Activity Category 1 – Capital and Operating Support – A Bridge Home (Activity Category 1). The State requires that all interest proceeds be used for HEAP-eligible activities. Consistent with Health and Safety Code Section 50214 (b), no more than five (5) percent of the total HEAP allocation plus interest proceeds may be used for general administrative purposes, and at least five (5) percent must be allocated to establishing or expanding services for youth experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness. This recommendation is consistent with State regulations.

REPROGRAMMING RECOMMENDATIONS

This report recommends that HEAP funds that will not be expended by June 30, 2020 be programmed for use in Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21. These recommendations will ensure that all HEAP funds are expended by the June 30, 2021 deadline and reduce the amount needed to fund these programs in FY 2020-21 from the State Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) Program. The remaining need for these programs will be included in an upcoming City

Administrative Officer (CAO) and Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) report. The reprogramming recommendations include:

- The Board of Public Works reports that HEAP funding in the amount of \$1,671,759.26 allocated for program and administrative costs for the Mobile Pit Stop and Mobile Shower programs in Skid Row (\$243,023) and Citywide (\$460,846), the Skid Row Street Sweeping and Litter Abatement (\$809,764), and Administrative Costs (\$158,126.26) from Activity Categories, 2, 3 and 5 will be unexpended by June 30, 2020. These funds are being recommended to fund these programs in FY 2020-21.
- An additional \$702,850 was recommended to be reprogramed from funds allocated to LAHSA in Activity Category 2 for the Skid Row Bin Tenant Improvements savings (\$86,850) and for restrooms at St. Vincent De Paul as the provider withdrew from the program (\$616,000). These funds are being recommended to be allocated to operating costs for the Skid Row Pit Stop Program in FY 2020-21.
- This Office reports an unspent HEAP balance of \$103,541.23 from funds allocated from Activity Category 3 – Capital, Operating, Services – Citywide to purchase a modular hygiene trailer for City-sponsored storage and Sherman Way Navigation Center for persons experiencing homelessness, which was completed in February 2020. These funds are recommended for reprogramming to Activity Category 1 to offset \$ 11,800,818 in operating costs for ABH projects in FY 2020-2021.

PREVIOUS REPROGRAMMING OF HEAP FUNDS

The Mayor and City Council previously approved a Motion (O'Farrell - Martinez; C.F. 20-0586) to reprogram \$1,237,700 allocated for the Sylmar Armory and 1819 South Western Ave ABH projects within HEAP Activity Category 1 – Capital and Operating Support – A Bridge Home. These two projects have encountered delayed service start dates and, as such, funds are expected to be unexpended by June 30, 2021. The Motion recommended these funds be allocated for one month of operating costs and furniture, fixtures, and equipment (FFE) for five (5) ABH sites that will be completed in June and July 2020 to ensure the opening of these sites is not delayed. Table 3 below summarizes this information.
