

Upper LA River Watershed Outlook



Central Santa Monica Bay Watershed Outlook





FY 23/24 WISP: Noteworthy Updates

FY 23/24 WISP: LAUSD and CBO / NGO Collaboration

- In response to CD 5's Council Motion (CF 23-0656), LASAN is proactively working to establish partnerships with the community.
- LASAN met with LAUSD to discuss project prioritizations and opportunities for initiating an MOA:
 - LASAN has identified 20 potential LAUSD school sites that have the potential for stormwater capture.
 - 8 of these identified schools have received CalFire grant funding to plan school greening.
- Building off the successful partnership with TPL for the South LA Green Alley Projects, LASAN is actively partnered with various CBOs/NGOs on 8 water quality projects;
 - LASAN has also supported the submission of 5 CBO/NGO applications to the SCWP.
 - LASAN will continue to coordinate and engage with various NGOs and CBOs to explore future partnership opportunities.





FY 23/24 WISP: Adaptive Management

Project Modifications:


- LA County initiated a new process for addressing projects modifications for all SCWP Regional funded activities.
- A PMR can be submitted annually by October 31st to report changes in project scope, schedule, and funding request.

SCWP Biennial Review:

- The ROC developed the SCWP Biennial Report to report findings regarding whether and the extent to which SCW Program requirements and goals were achieved.
- The report highlighted 6 recommendations to help better adaptively manage the program.
- Key findings to be implemented include:
 - Pause on new Round 6 (FY 25/26) Infrastructure apps;
 - Phase-based IP applications (Design-only, Constriction-only, and O&M); and
 - Watershed Area-based strategic planning.

Metrics and Monitoring Study (MMS):

- The MMS study is designed to develop program methods, metrics and monitoring criteria to inform tracking, planning, and decision making in the SCWP.
- Findings are scheduled to be released in the coming months and will be used to shape the Regional Program.



FY 23/24 WISP: Project Delivery


- The FY 22/23 WISP proposed that LASAN recommend that the City Council request the City Attorney to present an ordinance allowing for the utilization of Design-Build contracts for SCWP projects (CF 18-0384-S5):
 - The ordinance received City Council approval on February 9th, 2024.
 - On March 18th, 2024 the Mayor approved the ordinance and it became effective on April 22nd, 2024.
 - Draft RFQ is going through final reviews by City Atty/BCA. Anticipated to be considered by BPW in June 2024.
 - Upon adoption, LASAN plans to release an RFQ to establish an on-call list of qualified Design-Build firms and contractors.





FY 23/24 WISP: Projections of O&M Requirements

- LASAN has identified over 70 completed stormwater quality projects that require O&M and at least another 45 projects in the current stormwater CIP that will require O&M within the next 5 years.
 - Prop O projects have an estimated O&M cost of \$8M per year.
 - SCWP are projected to required an additional
 \$8-10M per year, \$4.5M starting FY 25/26.
- O&M needs for all projects will eventually total more than the entire revenue from the Measure W parcel tax.
 - To minimize the cost of O&M, LASAN will partner with CBOs to provide maintenance for as many projects as feasible.
- In the FY 23-24 WISP, LASAN recommends that all infrastructure projects funded by the regional program submit a five-year O&M funding request application
 1 year prior to construction completion.




Item 4: Community Outreach and Engagement Strategic Plan



Community Outreach and Engagement Strategic Plan

- City of LA SCWP Strategic Outreach and Engagement Plan (COESP):
 - The 2019 City Council file on the Governance Structure for Measure W - Safe, Clean Water Program (CF 18-0384-S1) instructed LASAN, with assistance from the CLA, COA, and other participating departments, to develop a strategic outreach plan to engage community stakeholders.
 - The COESP includes specifications regarding the SCWP's governance, branding, messaging, reporting requirements, as well as the SCWP Municipal and Regional Transfer Agreement community outreach and engagement requirements.
 - The COESP also provides direction for methods and materials for community outreach and engagement, delineated for three different types of programs.
 - The COESP is intended to be a living document, updated every two years.
