



# Prioritization Methodology

Priority Rating	Methodology
1	Projects that are: a) mostly in the Design, Bid & Award, or Construction phase of project delivery, and b) mainly related to safety improvements, have funding deadlines, and/or are Council Office priorities. These are active projects for which SID has staff to work on.
2	Projects that are: a) in the Pre Design or lower levels of the Design phase, and b) are not urgent safety improvement projects, do not have risk of losing funding, and/or are future projects. These projects have been put on hold until SID staff becomes available or additional staff is provided, or when Priority 1 projects are completed.
3	Projects that are in the Post-Construction phase. The remaining closeout work entails administrative items such completion of the as-built drawings, processing of close-out change orders, and/or pending acceptance by the Board of Public Works. Although these projects have completed construction, they still require some staff time to monitor the progress.

# Challenges

- Same resources currently working on capital project delivery may be asked to work on the Fire Relief Efforts and Olympic games from all City departments
- Unsuccessful in previous budget requests for additional staffing resources
- Six Construction Management Division authorized staff in Priority Critical Hiring (PCH) Process
- ATP timely use of funds deadlines are strict, and any delays and loss of funding in any phase can jeopardize the entire project. Incomplete projects are required to return all grants funds already spent
- Escalating construction costs require City to identify additional funding to advance projects
- AHSC project development process only allows for 2 months

## Steps Taken to Address Issues (Non-Budgetary)

- Utilize consultants to augment staff resources
- Request all available extensions within grant guidelines
- LADOT repurposing signal design team to support grants
- Reprioritized non-grants projects
- Work with other grantors with less stringent deadlines for extensions

# Possible Paths and Recommendations

What is needed to succeed

#### **Internal needs**

- Approval of current year budget requests
- Identify gap funding
- Moratorium on future non-Olympics grant opportunities
- PCH approval of 6 BOE/CMD positions
- Give up certain cycle funds and have priority to re-apply for future cycles

#### **External needs**

- Lobby Sacramento to allow funds to be reprogrammed to future years
- Request legislative support to pass a policy exemption due to resources being allocated in preparation of the Games
- Request revisions to the Timely Use of Funds Policies

# Ramifications

#### Ramifications of potentially <u>cancelling projects</u> and reapplying in future cycles:

- Need City Council approval.
- Will need to recompete in future cycles
- Benefits: may be able to right-cost when recompeting to address inflation

#### Ramifications of <u>not cancelling projects</u> and failing to meet the deadlines:

- Return expended funds
- City will be penalized in future grant cycles
- Benefits: None
